

Ffordd Cambria The Cambrian Way A470



The Cambrian Way is a complete northsouth journey along the mountainous spine of Wales, running for 185 miles (300km) from coast to coast. It winds through two National Parks - Snowdonia and the Brecon Beacons - and the Cambrian Mountains in between. At the north end you'll find the Victorian splendour of Llandudno. At the south is Cardiff, our cosmopolitan capital city.

The 'Cambrian Mountains' take their name from Cymru, our own name for Wales. To the north, the route cuts through the Snowdonia National Park and the highest peaks in Wales and England. The central section passes the wide-open spaces of Plynlimon/ Pumlumon, the spectacular lakelands of the Elan Valley, and the vast Tywi Forest. To the south, the road climbs again into the Brecon Beacons National Park.

Along the way, the road takes in market towns like Dolgellau, Machynlleth and Brecon. The slate-quarrying capital of Blaenau Ffestiniog has reinvented itself as our adventure sports capital. Down south, the route cuts right through the coal-mining Valleys, where tightly-packed terraces cling to the sides of steep hillsides. For its entire length, The Cambrian Way is criss-crossed by epic long-distance walking, cycling and horse-riding trails, which connect with the Wales Coast Path and Offa's Dyke Path.

It's also well worth straying off the A470 to discover loops and links off the beaten track. The best route of all, as always, is the one you'll discover for yourself.



Ffordd yr Arfordir The Coastal Way Predominantly A487



The Coastal Way runs the entire length of Cardigan Bay. It's a 180-mile (290km) route that threads between blue seas on one side and big mountains on the other.

The start/end points - Aberdaron and St Davids - are both ancient pilgrimage destinations. In between, the coast is dotted with harbour towns and resorts, fishing villages and secret coves.

There are vast stretches of sand to the north, towering cliffs to the south, and beaches of all kinds in between. Offshore, the seas are home to whales, porpoises and dolphins. Inland, the views are framed by mountains.

The route's cultural highlights include Harlech Castle, the fantasy village of Portmeirion, and St Davids Cathedral. But you'll also come across memorable spots off the beaten track. There are plenty of loops and diversions to explore: the north coast of the Llŷn Peninsula, Snowdonia, Pumlumon, Preseli ... endless ways to discover your own secret places.

Wherever you go, there's freshlycaught seafood on the menu, together with lamb and beef from the pastures, and local craft ales. There's also the full range of places to stay, from coastal cottages to wild camping sites.



Ffordd y Gogledd The North Wales Way A55



The North Wales Way follows the old trading route along our northern coast into Anglesey. Quite apart from the resort towns and whopping castles that line the 75-mile (120km) trail, it's the jumping-off point for journeys of discovery in the panoramic north. From here you can explore the Vales of Clwyd and Conwy, the mountains of Snowdonia, the Menai Strait, and our largest island, Anglesey.

It's the castles that immediately grab your attention. There's the perfect concentric design of Beaumaris, the polygonal towers of Caernarfon, and the sheer heft of Conwy and its town walls. Together with Harlech, this cluster of 13th-century castles forms a UNESCO World Heritage site.

The north coast has several classic resorts along the way. The mountains of Snowdonia - its Welsh name is Eryri, meaning 'place of eagles' - loom large on the southern horizon. Cross the Menai Strait and you're on Anglesey, the ancient stronghold of the Celtic druids.

There are plenty of loops and interesting diversions too. It's the gateway to the Vale of Clwyd, where a string of handsome market towns line the route down to Llangollen. The North Wales Way links easily with its sister routes, public transport, and longdistance cycling and walking routes.
