Pellter:

Porth Penrhyn - Bethesda: 7 milltir / 11km

Felin Fawr - Nant Ffrancon: 2 milltir / 3km

Mae Lôn Las Ogwen yn cychwyn ym Mhorth Penrhyn ar gyrion Dinas Bangor ac yn dilyn y gyn rheilffordd gul tuag at bentref Glasinfryn. Arferai'r rheilffordd gludo llechi o Chwarel Y Penrhyn i harbwr Porth Penrhyn. Yng Nglasinfryn mae'r llwybr yn ymuno ar gyn rheilffordd i Fethesda a byddwch yn croesi'r draphont ac ymlaen at y bont dros y A4244 tuag at Dregarth. Wrth adael Tregarth am Fethesda byddwch yn mynd dwy'r Twnnel Tywyll a dros y draphont uwchben yr afon Ogwen. Ar ôl cyrraedd tref Bethesda ceuwch y cyfle i ymuno a chymal arall o'r daith sy'n eich tywys o hen weithdai llechi Felin Fawr a heibio chwarel Penrhyn ac ymlaen i Nant Ffrancon.

Distance:

Port Penrhyn - Bethesda: 7 miles / 11km

Felin Fawr - Nant Ffrancon: 2 miles / 3km

Lon Las Ogwen starts at Porth Penrhyn on the outskirts of Bangor and follows the former narrow gauge railway to the village of Glasinfryn. The former railway was built to carry slate from Penrhyn Quarry to the harbour at Port Penrhyn. From Glasinfryn the path joins the former main line to Bethesda, you'll be passing over the impressive viaduct and the bridge over the A4244 towards Tregarth. When leaving Tregarth for Bethesda you will pass through the tunnel (Twnnel Tywyll) and over the viaduct above the Ogwen river. After arriving at Bethesda you can join another section of the route from the former slate workshops at Felin Fawr and past Penrhyn Quarry into the Ffrancon Valley.
